#### Rationale for the above order:

- 1. The face is an obvious starting point for young children. This PP gives the basic nouns only.
- 2. The body parts provide an obvious progression to the face. This PP gives basic nouns only.
- 3. This PP introduces the idea of possession your 'do' and what it does to the subsequent nouns. It is presented in a simple song format.
- 4. This PP continues with the idea of possession but introduces 'my' 'mo'. The emphatic form is also introduced.
- 5. The Hair PP introduces 'air', 'oirre', 'orm' & 'ort' and basic sentence construction of positive statements using the verb 'to be'.
- 6. The Mòr PP introduces the idea of masc/fem nouns and how fem nouns cause lenition.
- 7. This PP reinforces masc/fem nouns and reinforces 'air'.
- 8. Does the same as 7 but reinforces 'oirre'.
- 9. This PP reinforces 'mo' and brings in the repetitive element of storytelling for young children.
- 10. This PP again reinforces 'mo' ('my' is a very important concept for children at this stage of development) and once again uses the repetitive element of storytelling.

By using the PPs in the recommended order, progression of language is inbuilt.



# **Additional Support**

All power points are supported by sound files. Translations are all included in the notes.

## Songs

The songs have been categorised into 3 levels as follows:

- 1. Simple songs to start with suitable for infants of 0-3 years but may also be enjoyed by 3-5 year olds.
- 2. Simple songs with more challenging vocabulary suitable for 3-5 year olds but may also be enjoyed by infants of 0-3 years.
- 3. Songs that introduce vocabulary from other themes (e.g. colour) or longer songs more suitable for 3-5 year olds and older children.

All songs create opportunities for actions and come with the following:

- Gaelic lyrics
- English Translation
- Sound file

Songs highlighted in blue have an accompanying online video or DVD (e.g. Cabag) Songs highlighted in pink have a power point with its sound file attached.
