#### Rationale for the above order:

- 1. This presentation introduces some basic vocabulary associated with Hallowe'en (e.g. a pumpkin, a witch etc)
- 2. This presentation uses some of the vocabulary from no. 1 and presents it in a simple song.
- 3. This presentation also uses some of the vocabulary from no. 1 and presents it in a simple song.
- 4. This presentation uses some of the vocabulary from no. 1 and presents it in a simple song. This song provides some extension of vocabulary.
- 5. This presentation uses the Hallowe'en vocabulary in the context of possession. (e.g Who has a black cat? Sine has a black cat.)
- 6. This presentation introduces the difference of a costume being worn by a male (air) or female (oirre) as well as using the verb 'to be' in a defining sense. ('S e ...)
- 7. This presentation extends the language of Hallowe'en into a short story.

By using the PPs in the recommended order, progression of language is inbuilt.
